# **Employment growth slows, unemployment rate increases**

CARSON CITY, NV - According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation's (DETR) September 2024 economic report, the pace of job growth over the last 12 months slowed from 2.9 percent to 2.1 percent in September and the total number of jobs in the state was unchanged from August at 1,582,000. Nevada's unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percentage points to 5.6 percent and the labor force grew by 996.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) Employment (Seasonally Adjusted):

- Las Vegas employment decreased by 1,700 jobs (-0.1%) since August, an increase of 26,400 jobs (2.3%) since September 2023.
- Reno employment had an increase of 2,900 jobs (1.1%) since August, an increase of 5,500 jobs (2.0%) since September 2023.
- Carson City employment had an increase of 300 jobs (0.9%) since August, an increase of 900 jobs (2.8%) since September 2023.

"Nevada's labor market softened in September, as unemployment increased again and employment growth slowed from 2.9 percent to 2.1 percent. From August to September overall employment was unchanged; the construction and leisure industries saw the largest declines, offset by gains in professional and business services as well as smaller gains in most other sectors. At the same time, hourly wages rose at the fastest pace so far this year to an average of \$30.69 from July-September, a gain of 4.2% compared to the same period in 2023" said David Schmidt, Chief Economist.

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# Nevada Statewide & Metro Area Labor Market Overview

#### September 2024

Published on October 17, 2024

In September 2024, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada increased by 0.1 percentage points and now sits at 5.6 percent. The labor force grew by 996 over the month. This increase in labor force was the result of a decrease of 363 in employed individuals and an increase of 1,359 in unemployed individuals.

There was no change in the number of jobs in the state of Nevada, as indicated by the September CES (Current Employment Statistics) numbers. Some industries saw gains, such as Professional and Business Services, which saw an increase of 1,700 jobs from August to September. However, other industries such as Leisure and Hospitality saw decreases, with the industry shrinking by 1,900 jobs over the month.

The Las Vegas MSA saw a decrease equivalent to 1,700 jobs (or -0.1%) over the month. Meanwhile, the Reno MSA saw an increase of 2,900 jobs (or 1.1%). Finally, the Carson City MSA saw an increase of 300 jobs (0.9%)

#### **Current Employment Statistics (CES)**

Estimates for this section come from the Current Employment Statistics (CES) program sponsored by the Bureau of Labor statistics (<u>BLS</u>). Total nonfarm employment was unchanged from August to September, a growth rate of 0.0%. Since September 2023, total nonfarm employment increased by 33,100 jobs, or 2.1%. 

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

#### Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

Figures for our unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program sponsored by the (BLS). Nevada's unemployment rate was 5.6 percent in September, increased by 0.1 percentage points (pp) from 5.5 percent in August, and increased by 0.4 pp from 5.2 percent in September 2023, seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 1,359 from August for a current level of 91,099 people, which increased by 7,070 unemployed people since September 2023. The labor force in Nevada is currently 1,621,849 people, which increased by 996 people from August, and increased by 11,088 people since September 2023.




## **Unemployment Rate State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)**



## **Employment State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)**


According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Nevada had the fourth highest over-the-year employment growth for the month of August at a figure of 3 percent.





Employment growth year-over-year





# **Unemployment Insurance**

Turning to our monthly data, in September 2024, 10,209 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, a decrease of 1,880 claims, or 15.6 percent, from August 2024 when there were 12,089 claims. This figure is an increase from the 8,854 figure that was observed in September of 2023.







Monthly claims activity for Nevada's regular program saw increases across nearly all measures, initial claims decreased by 1,880, or 15.6 percentage points. Weeks Compensated and final payments (also known as exhaustions) increased by 12,119 and 285 respectively. Total compensation was up by nearly \$5,800,000 or 15.3 percent.




