

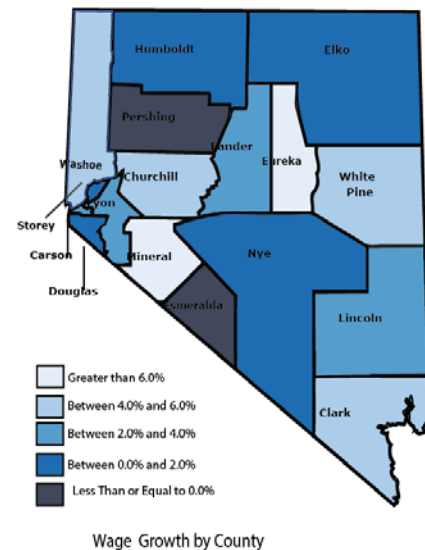
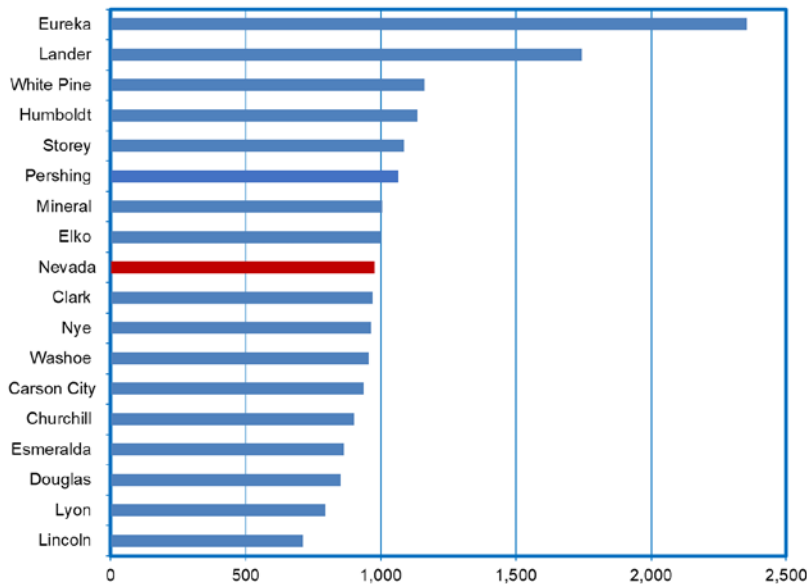

Eureka/Lander/White Pine Pay the Highest Average Weekly Wages; Mineral Realizes Highest Rate of Growth



- In the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) Program, the Research and Analysis Bureau collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by Nevada unemployment insurance laws, and federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees.
- Based upon this information, Nevada wages averaged \$977 per week, as of 2018:IQ. This is a 4.9 percent increase relative to the same period in 2017. Weekly wages range from \$712 (Lincoln) to \$2355 (Eureka). Eight counties have payrolls above \$1,000 per week. This can be attributed to their high concentration of mining, and in Storey County, logistics and manufacturing.
- As for Nevada's major population centers, Carson City wages totaled \$935 per week through the first quarter. Washoe County, at \$956, came in just below the statewide average. Clark County was slightly below State average at \$970 per week.
- Change in weekly wages range from -8.6% (Esmeralda) to 12.3% (Mineral). Fifteen of 17 counties experienced an increase in average weekly wages in this year's first quarter. The decrease in wages in Esmeralda and Pershing are most likely attributable to loss of mining jobs and their relatively high wages.
- As for Nevada's major population centers, Carson City grew at a rate less than the Silver State at 3.1%. Wages in Clark County and Washoe County both grew slightly higher than the statewide average, growing at 5.2 and 5.1 percent respectively.
