Relatively Large Operations Realize the Strongest Growth in Warehousing Industry

- In the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) Program, the Research and Analysis Bureau collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by Nevada unemployment insurance laws, and federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees.
- Warehousing/Storage (NAICS 493000) has long been a vital and growing industry in Nevada.
 This research note will look at employment levels and changes based on the relative size of
 the establishments in this industry over the seven year period (2010:IIIQ to 2017:IIIQ). 2010:IIIQ
 represents one of the lower points in the recession.
- Total employment in this industry grew from 8,800 to 18,700 from 2010:IIIQ to 2017:IIIQ. This translates to just over 110% over this period.
- Statewide, the size class that experienced the largest growth was size class 8 (employing at least 500) at nearly 270 percent¹. This trend is consistent in both Northern and Southern Nevada.
- Compared to other industries at the 3 digit level, Warehousing (493) has experienced stronger growth than all but 6 of the 93 industries during this period.
