

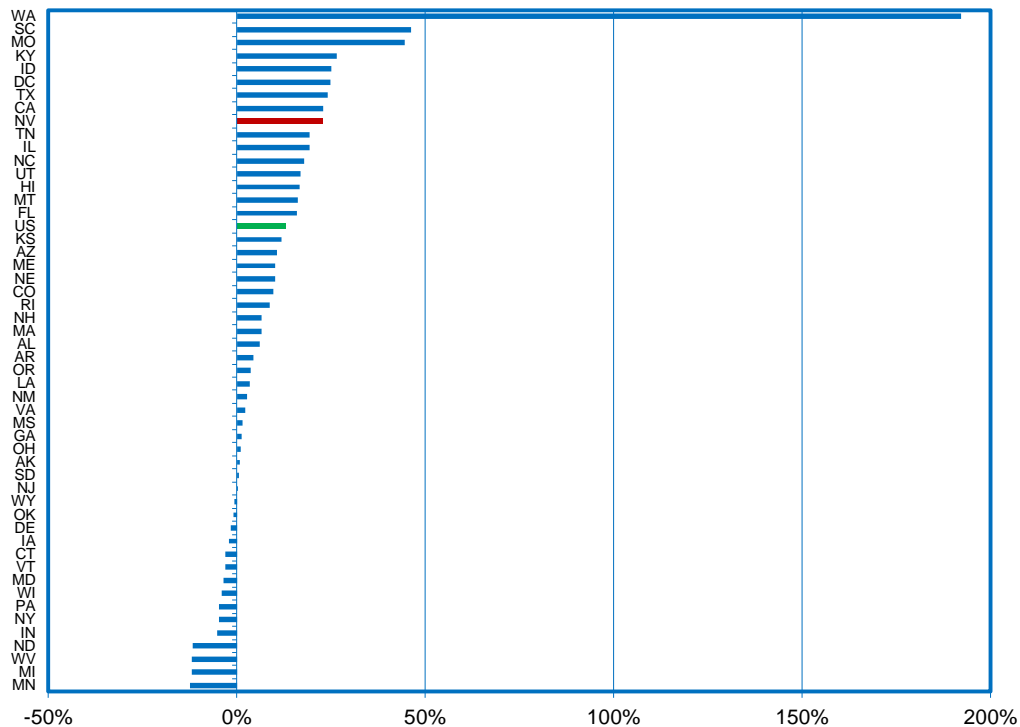

## Nevada Ranks 9<sup>th</sup> in Establishment Openings from 2014:IIQ-2018:IIQ



- The Bureau of Labor Statistics' Business Employment Dynamics Program allows us to look at the relative performance as it pertains to business establishment openings. We take a look at BED data on the number of average quarterly growth rate in business openings (seasonally adjusted) for Nevada, the U.S., and all states from 2014:IIQ and 2018:IIQ.
- The number of establishment openings in Nevada increased to 4,394 in 2018:IIQ up from 3,586. Establishment openings 2018:IIQ for Nevada growth, was 23% compared to 13% for the United States.
- Since 2014:IIQ, trends in business establishment openings have seen stronger growth than in the nation as a whole. Nevada ranked 9<sup>th</sup> best in the US for growth of establishment openings, based upon BED measures, comparably the US ranked 17<sup>th</sup>.
- The states with the most establishment openings in 2018:IIQ were Washington with 192% and South Carolina up 46%. The largest declines realized in establishment openings were Minnesota and Missouri down 12%.
